## Practice Supervisor Bitesize Learning 4 – An Introduction to VARK Learning Styles



Learning outcome – explore how a knowledge of different learning styles supports teaching and learning in practice

Access and read Fleming & Baume (2006) who write about VARK learning styles and highlight that

- A person's preferred learning style can greatly influence how they learn.
- A person's preferred learning style should be matched with appropriate learning strategies if possible.
- Information that is accessed through the persons preferred learning style results in an increase in their levels of comprehension, motivation, and understanding

## VARK Learning Styles – Developing communication skills



Reflect and make some notes

Visual

Watch how others communicate

Watch video resources about effective communication and reflect



Aural

Listen to the way others communicate and reflect on this Verbalise how to do this to build confidence



Read/write

Read about effective communication

Write goals/scripting



Kinesthetic

Make notes
