Description

- The student assisted in face-to-face assessments of clients through the Forensic LD Service and online assessments of clients via NHS Near Me with the Community LD Service
- The student also attended Community Learning Disability Team Meetings via Microsoft Teams

Preparation

- PE familiarised herself with the functionality of the NHS Near Me system so as to help advise the the student
 - PE also adapted some assessments for presentation via video and identified assessments that could be conducted online
- The student registered for Microsoft Teams and familiarised herself with it

WHAT WENT WELL?

For the team & the students

The student was able to conduct a **wide range of assessments** with clients, likely more than if all visits had been face to face

An unexpected benefit was that **video assessment** could allow for so **many online assessments** quite effectively.

The student was very positive about the placement and **she gained autonomy and confidence**, as her objectives were to gain experiencing in conducting more formal assessments and report writing. The student commented that she felt it was the **best placement she had attended**.

WHAT WERE SOME LEARNING POINTS?

- The video assessments and consultations **only worked well** for patients with **mild learning difficulties** and who were **IT literate**.
- There were also some **connectivity issues** that hindered the efficacy of the video treatments.
 - Face to face contact with both patients and PEs was vital during this placement; as offices become more populated again, this could prove to be difficult to faciliate.
