Workbook 13: Conducting Outcome Measures



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#### 13.1 Aim

The aim of this workbook is to introduce the Healthcare Support Worker (HCSW) to conducting outcome measures and to conduct tests accurately.

## **13.2 Learning Outcomes**

By the end of this workbook you will be able to:

- Describe the purpose of an outcome measure.
- Follow a test protocol to conduct the test.
- Accurately record test results in patient records.
- Report your findings to the therapist.

#### 13.3 What are Outcome Measures?

Outcome measures are carefully designed tests that measure some aspect of the patients performance. Examples used in Physiotherapy would be tests designed to measure walking speed, arm function, balance or disability. These are called outcome measures because they are often used before the start of Physiotherapy, sometimes during the course of the therapy and at the end of the therapy episode to measure the outcome of the treatment.

Because they are used to compare the patient's performance on more than one occasion, it is important that they are done in a standardised way. This is so that any change measured can be attributed to actual change in the condition of the patient and not to differences in the way that the test was done on the two occasions.
